After first hearing the album "Charlie Parker at Storyville," when he was a child, Rich Moore knew what he wanted to do with his life. Make music. Since the age of seventeen, Rich has been active as a freelance woodwind player. He performs and records regularly with many of Chicago's finest musicians and has been on stage in nearly all of the major local venues. While his main focus is Jazz, versatility and adaptability have given him the tools necessary to make music in a variety of genres. Moore, who has been actively performing music since age 17, began working as an assistant professor at IJC in 2013. Before that, he was on the faculty at Northern Illinois University and Moraine Valley Community College. At NIU, Moore served as the Jazz Combo Coordinator and taught jazz and classical saxophone classes. He also coached saxophone quartets and served as a clinician and guest artist. He is in-demand as a clinician and maintains a home studio with top students from the Naperville, Aurora, Oswego, and Geneva school districts. Since 1999, Rich's reputation as an in-demand educator continues to grow. His considerable teaching experience includes private lessons in jazz and classical saxophone, clarinet and flute, saxophone master classes, improvisation master classes, jazz ensemble clinics, guest artist appearances, jazz combo coaching, chamber ensemble coaching and sectional coaching. In addition to teaching at the collegiate level, Rich also currently maintains lesson studios at many of the larger area high schools, including: Lake Zurich, Naperville North, Neuqua Valley, Waubonsie, Oswego, and Geneva. Overall, Rich's students range from elementary school to professional levels.

In addition to his busy teaching schedule, Rich is a sought-after clinician and adjudicator. He has worked with and performed as a guest artist with many high school jazz ensembles throughout the Chicago Suburbs. His jazz clinics have addressed many topics including style, feel and time, sound, articulation, ensemble playing, improvisation, active listening and music history.

In 2002, he earned a Bachelor of Music degree in Saxophone Performance and Jazz Studies from Northern Illinois University where he studied with Steve Duke, Ron Carter, Art Davis, Fareed Haque, Paul McKee, Joey Sellers, and Steve Squires. In 2008, Rich returned to NIU, and in 2010 earned his Master's degree in Clarinet.
